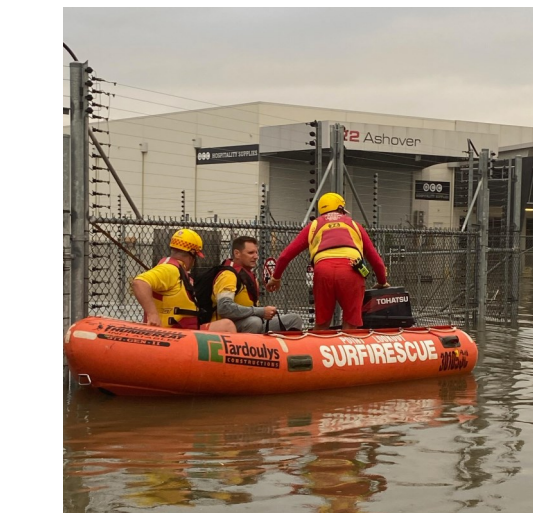
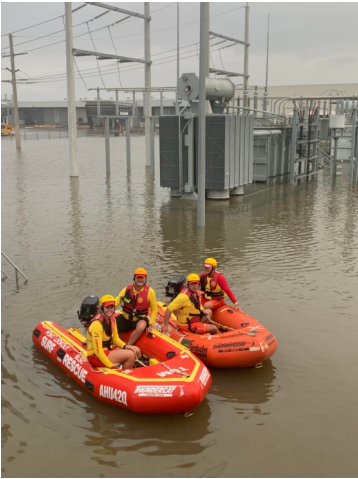

# Rescue of the Month

Congratulations to the following members that were nominated for rescue of the month this season:

## Southport—Dale McVeigh, Carol & Chantel Templeton, Melissa Vincent—September 2021

We arrived to patrol early and a member of the Club alerted us to the incident North of the Sheraton (Council lifeguards had not started yet).

The patient was bleeding profusely from a fin chop to her calf, and the scene was quite confronting, but I'm proud to say, all members conducted themselves extremely well and in a calm manner. Lifesavers were able to apply the correct first aid treatment and at all times communication via mobile phone was maintained and surf com were kept updated.



Despite the size of the wound, we were able to stem the flow of the bleed until QAS arrived. She required internal and external stitches and a short hospital stay.



## Southport—Trent Baker, Imogen McMaster, Ruby Hillson-Taylor, Jarrod Roberts—November 2021

I'm sitting having a coffee with our Club President looking at the water and we both committed on how amazing the conditions were and we should have a quiet day.....Jinx!

7:15am. It went pear shaped

A member of the public approached us and said she believed a man was having a heart attack at a building behind the club. Two off us attended whilst another member stayed in view of the club to direct the person who was collecting oxygen, defib & first aid. The patient had fallen due to a heart attack (later confirmed by paramedics) and hit his head on the wall. He had sharp chest and shoulder pain, was ghostly grey (in shock) a large split on his head and had lost 3 teeth, was in and out of consciousness and had very shallow breathing. We worked on the patient for nearly 10 minutes keeping him on oxygen and monitoring vitals with frequent loss of consciousness and his breathing changing from shallow to almost non existent. Defib was not applied as we had a slow but steady pulse and most of the time the patient was mildly responsive (we were also concerned about putting the patient on his back due to the steady bleeding from his mouth). While dealing with the major issues we stopped the bleeding on his head and collected the teeth for the Paramedics to take.

Paramedics took over care when they arrived and continued to work on the patient before transferring him to hospital. I was very proud of how my team handled a terrible situation and was reassured by the Paramedics that we had done everything we could for the patient who left our care alive because of our quick response.

Congratulations to our patrol members who attended the incident and to the whole Patrol that continued beach set up, other minor first aid and public safety while this was going on.

While the challenges mentioned previously, took their toll on our community we still defied the odds to grow our membership in South Coast Branch with our Junior Activity area in particular having the highest growth of all membership categories, which goes well for our longer term future.

Again our flagged areas experienced no lives lost which is a credit to all our patrolling members and Lifeguards.

Sadly the drowning rate continues to grow outside the flags on Gold Coast Beaches and we must continue to work closely

with the relevant authorities, community educators, media outlets and tourism operators to deliver the most effective messaging and provide extended services and systems that prevent people swimming in known high risk times and areas along our stretch of beaches.

In acknowledgement, may I first of all thank the South Coast Club Presidents for their support and commitment to the Branch and on their behalf thank the wonderful support of all three levels of Government for their financial support and guidance with our club's services, facilities, sport events and facility leases.

Also thank you to Kennards Hire for their donation of hire equipment for our sport events and to those clubs that hosted a Branch carnival this season—we appreciate your commitment to running our events.

I wish to thank a committed Executive Team who are very focused on supporting and developing our Clubs and members where ever possible and positioning South Coast Branch in a stronger position to be able to provide the guidance and assistance our members seek to be able to do their job effectively and safely.

# South Coast Branch Club President Reports



Point Lookout SLSC

Matt Robinson (Emu) - Acting President

It gives me great pleasure to be presenting my first President's report for the 74th season of the Point Lookout Surf Life Saving Club.

Once again Point Lookout has delivered another successful season. For the first time in our history, we had an all-female Club Captain leadership group, which consisted of Sarah Sammut, Anne-Marie Westby and Hayley Robinson. These ladies did a fantastic job each weekend and it was great to see our members support them throughout the season.

As always, our Club spirit is strong, most active members young and old were fully engaged. However, at times our patrol numbers were tight, the quality of patrol operations never dropped.

Our members have collectively patrolled 8,838 hours, below is a snapshot of the last couple of seasons:

The volume of people visiting North Stradbroke Island (Minjerribah) has significantly increased over the last 12 months, putting extra pressures on areas such as, accommodation, eateries, ferries, buses and especially the beaches. In our case the team at Point Lookout dug deeper and ensured that not only the two beaches we patrol had the red and yellow flags flying, but through roving patrols, wave runner operations and radio room patrols, we kept a close eye on most of Straddie. We have attended numerous rescues and critical incidents throughout the season with mixed outcomes,

however the standards shown by our members that performed these cases were truly exemplary.

At the start of the season, Covid continued to have a big effect on our patrols and junior activities however as restrictions began to "ease" things began to return to a new normal. One casualty of the pandemic I believe is the sense of altruism of people in society has diminished. Something that surf lifesaving is built upon. This I believe has contributed to us and other clubs at times struggling retain member numbers.

Junior Activities kept their numbers firm from last season to cope with the ever-changing Covid restrictions but still



managed to have a successful year. The weather for the last part of the season was questionable, with the rain and floods seeing State Titles being a wash out, that was extremely disappointing considering the level of talent ready to compete for the Point.

Our traditional fundraising efforts and income this season have, although being testing due to Covid, have been quite successful. We 'tweaked' our SOS Week model and had great success, we also finally held our Annual Event "Prawns at the Point", which was postponed in early January due to an outbreak on the island.

The club building like so many other Clubs continues a big drain on our funds and the last two seasons seem to have been the worst. Thankfully, our Old Boys, the Supporters Club, the Redland City Council and our very special sponsors stick by us to make up some of the shortfall.

As the flags go down for another season and I take my noddy hat off, I once again say thank you to all our fellow Club members and across the state who pull on a uniform and do their duties, on behalf of the bathing public.

With patrol as our foundation, we were then able to run our fantastic weekly Nipper program that continues to go from strength to strength, so I also want to thank all that are involved in making that happen particularly our age managers, water safety, BBQ crew, our wonderful families and all the support team that carry out roles that sometimes can go

unnoticed. It's a full team effort and all contributes to what our families see, experience and rave about. Again, mid-season statistics show we had a 30% increase in Nippers to just under 100 members.



Like any volunteer organisation we rely on funding and sponsorship, and I want to thank Deb Price, Lance Price & Colin Sloane for their great work in securing funding through grants and other opportunities. We were successful this season in securing \$35,000 State Gambling Grant which along with \$10,000 SLSC Beach Safe Funding we were able to purchase a new D-Max Patrol vehicle to replace our old one that was over 10 years old.

Lastly, I we were lucky enough to have a new Club Supervisor this season and I want to thank Shelley Schultz for her guidance and support it has been amazing.

I look forward to seeing you all on the beach for the 2022 / 2023 season and I look forward to another exciting year ahead.

## Southport SLSC Shane Roberts - President

Southport SLSC has experienced a significant increase in member investment in our future across season 2021-2022. Wide member consultation preceded the drafting and final publication of a strategic plan that will guide us through to 2030. This plan outlines four strategic pillars - Our People | Our Culture | Our Place | Our Connection. These pillars are underpinned by 5 values that guide our membership and staff - Reliability | Commitment | inclusivity | Contribution | Service. Enacting these values has resulted in Southport SLSC once again achieving desired results in the key performance indicator of cadet and youth member retention. Our investment in these members is considered an investment in our future by the management committee.



Southport SLSC has continued patrolling Main Beach with very healthy patrol numbers. With an average of 11 bronze medallions and 6 SRCs per patrol group, we are graced with minimal absences of only 2 members per patrol during the season. This has enabled our 243 active members to protect the 90000 visitors to our beach during patrol season, and in particular enact the 2931 preventative actions that have kept



the public safe. We have been supported through the purchase of a range of new lifesaving equipment made possible from the grants available to us during the season. Our thanks to the Grant Seeking Unit for their support in this space.



Our nipper program is again one of the largest on the Gold Coast, which presents complexities to our Junior Activities committee in the coordination of our Sunday Fundays. Within Junior Activities we are supported by a large parent volunteer base, without which we could not cater for the 400+ nippers who choose to call our club their club. This volunteer base has contributed to the signing of two new major sponsors in 2022.

The focus for Southport SLSC into the near future is our centenary as an organisation. Interestingly we were not the first lifesaving club to patrol Main Beach, with two clubs being established prior to Southport SLSC in 1924. Our impending centenary has invigorated a focus on the heritage component of our buildings, with plans to highlight this heritage in future renovations and developments.

On behalf of Southport SLSC and its members I extend thanks to South Coast Branch for their support throughout the season. Across all administration, surf sports, junior activities, lifesaving, education, membership and operational aspects the support has been appreciated.

We look forward to next season and as we all work towards getting back to normal.

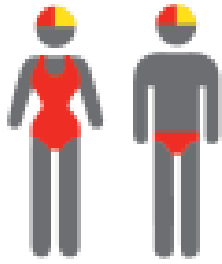

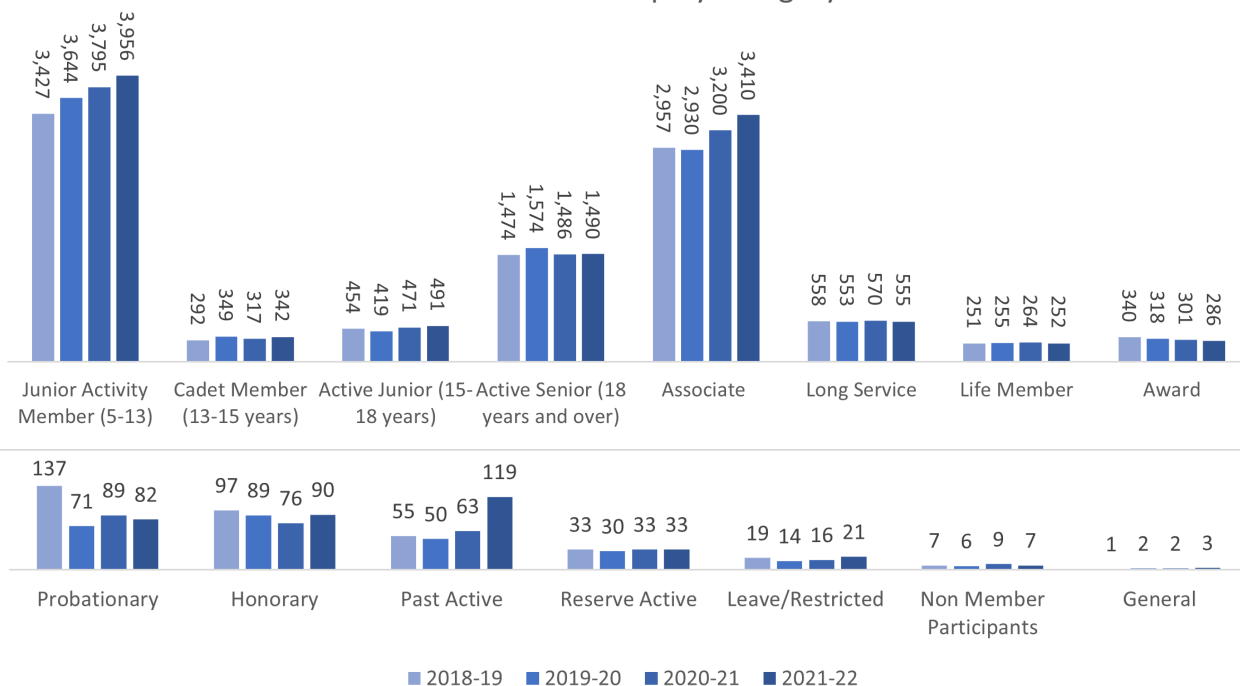

# Education Report

## Richard Morgan—Director of Education

As the season started, there was still some quiet optimism that QLD had kept the dreadful Covid-19 virus under control and very few of us had been impacted, or even knew someone impacted. For me, this changed during the Southport School Holiday Course, when one unfortunate participant tested positive for the virus, resulting in 87 members, a combination of participants, instructors, waters safety and support members went into 14 days quarantine, along with the extended family members, over 300 members were impacted. Although Southport were very unfortunate to be impacted, it did highlight a number of lessons learnt: the requirement for accurate record keeping of members involved with the course, the extended membership support (provision of coffee runs, mail drops and those stepping up to ensure all the patrols were covered) and what a great organization Surf Life Saving is, it brings together a wonderful group of giving members with a common community serving culture. Many thanks to all our Surf Life Savers, we all deserve a true pat on the back.

With the border relaxations in the new year, and the new Omicron virus strain, hardly a Club or Course escaped the virus and many more quarantined members ensued. Again, all credit to Clubs and their members for riding this storm and stepping up to the plate when needed. Thankfully, as we move into autumn, we do seem to be reaching a level of acceptance and a pathway to some normality.

Although another difficult season, South Coast Branch (SCB) Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators (TAF's) have still been very busy, with 2,319 new awards gained by Branch members (Table 1) and a further 6,007 awards updated through skills maintenance (Table 2). The increase in new awards is not surprising as although the Aquatic Rescue Awards, which includes the Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate Awards (SRC) are tracking well, along with the IRB Awards, the numbers are distorted with the disproportionate number of Emergency Care Awards, since the introduction of the First Aid into the Bronze, and the CPR Award into the SRC. Skills Maintenance numbers decreased this year, with a general reduction across all Awards. This might have been impacted by the high increase through 2020/21 as the virus did not impact last season.

Of more significant concern, is the continued problems growing our TAFs, which has been a concern for several years and presented in previous annual reports:

### Emergency Care Facilitators:

Lack of available Facilitators to deliver the Emergency Care Awards – Further reduction in numbers from 2020/21.

### IRB TAFs

Facilitators – These positions are appointed by SLSQ IRB Panel, and although 2020/21 had 7 Facilitator, this reduced to 6 for this season – SCB Lifesaving Committee did approve 11 IRB Assessors to Train and Assess Courses, acting within the old traditional Facilitator role.

Assessors – There is still a lack of IRB Assessors across the Branch, albeit this appears manageable for new courses, it is difficult to plan for Skills Maintenance sessions. Loss of 5 Assessors with only 2 new Awards gained – Net loss 3

Trainers – Loss of 10 trainers with only 2 new Awards gained – Net loss 8

### Bronze TAFs

Facilitators – Additional 10 Assessors approved to be Facilitators

Assessors – Loss of 15 Assessors with only Zero new Awards gained – Net loss 15

Trainers – Loss of 19 Trainers with only 1 new Award gained – Net loss 18

### New Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators

Following a canvas directly to Clubs by SLSQ, the following is a summary of SCB members who registered for TAF Courses:

2020/21 49 Registered – Number completed their training – 6, Withdrawn 11

This also included 9 SCB members registered for a Facilitators Course, which was funded by SCB through a QFES Grant, None of these member have completed their Awards, as 2 withdrew.

2021/22 15 Registered – Number completed their training – 0

To help manage the ongoing problems within the delivery of Education Awards across the Branch and the considerable pressure on CTO's to Deliver, the Branch Council approved the introduction of the following new roles:

Emergency Care Advisor – To support Clubs in running Emergency Care Courses and oversee the development of Branch Run Courses

Beach Management and Operational Advisor – To Facilitate and arrange Silver Medallion Beach Management Courses, Gold Medallion and Vehicle Based training (SSV, 4WD & Tractor)



# Education Report

TAF Development Officer – To support the Branch in running Trainer Courses and assist Clubs in mentoring and developing Proby Trainers, with inter-Club support to ensure there is sufficient opportunities for Proby Trainers to gain the experience they require.

On a final note of concern, the Director of Education, was initially not endorsed as SCB Representative on the State Education Panel, however, this did change midway through the season although there was a move for the Education Panel to be disbanded, with the SLSQ Administration to form work Panel meetings, with selected Branches, as they feel necessary. The SCB Director of Lifesaving expressed concern around the Governance of this and a subsequent decision has now been reached whereby a review will be undertaken on the future of Education Panel and how this could work within the State, which was generally accepted by all Branch Education Reps across Queensland.

Finally, and as with every season, I would like to extend my appreciation to all the unsung heroes within the Clubs, who provide water safety support and general assistance when needed, without who, the delivery of Courses and Skills Maintenance at both Club and Branch level would not be achieved.

I would also like to thank the ongoing support and efforts of the dedicated and high-quality Trainers, Assessors, Facilitators and administrative support who year on year keep on committing to the delivery of high quality Education within the Branch. I cannot express enough my appreciation for the hours of hard-work, commitment, dedication and support provided by all, many thanks.

I am sure all members will also join me with their appreciation of the efforts of all those involved in Education.

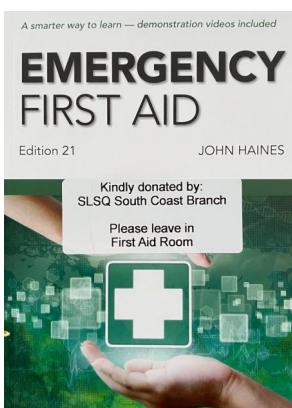
# Emergency Care Report

# Surf Sports Report

## Melinda Jackson—Director of Surf Sports

It is with great pleasure I present the 2021/2022 South Coast Branch Annual Surf Sport's Report.

Another massive season for surf sports in our Branch. Sixteen carnivals and a number of special events were coordinated by clubs in the South Coast Branch in the 2021/22 summer season. This started with the Qld Endurance Championships at Burleigh Heads Mowbray Park SLSC in September and concluded with the three Australian Championship events co-hosted by Broadbeach SLSC, Kurrawa SLSC and North Kirra SLSC. The winter IRB racing and pool rescue events are being conducted as this report is written with carnivals being held on our beaches and in our pools. The diversity of events offered to our members is extensive across short distance, long distance; ocean, beach, craft, IRB, boats, surf rescue, pool rescue, R&R, March Past; and ages U08 to Masters. A substantial undertaking from a core group of volunteers within each club.



The Interbranch team trials were held at Mermaid Beach SLSC in early October with over 100 U13-U17 talented athletes trialling for their place in the Team. The strength of the team, their professionalism, teamwork and sportsmanship was exemplary. The team travelled to the Sunshine Coast and came away with a second place. conditions forced a move to the Broadwater. Unfortunately, COVID19 restrictions resulted in the cancellation of the Champion Patrol and First Aid events. The SEQ R&R returned to Broadbeach and Miami SLSC continued their support of the Junior Activity carnivals. #### **1. Statement of Accounting Policies**

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Association Incorporations Act*. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act*, and the following Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements:

No other Australian Accounting Standards or authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared accruals basis and is based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

#### **(b) Property Plant and Equipment**

Plant and equipment is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Buildings are valued at fair value less accumulated depreciation. Building Improvements are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

The Branch Headquarters are designated as a special purpose non-residential building and net replacement value is utilised as fair value. The building was independently valued on 30 April 2004. The building has since been revalued using ABS Index 6427 – Construction of Non-Residential Buildings Queensland. This revaluation was made effective from 1 May 2010. A review of this index in May 2012 revealed that the variation in this index was -0.4%. The Committee resolved that this movement was immaterial and not to revalue the building in 2013/14. No further revaluation has been made at 30 April 2022.

Depreciation has been applied over the useful life of the assets as follows:-

On the 16<sup>th</sup> May 2004 South Coast Branch invested an amount of \$100,000 in the Surf Rescue Trust Fund administered by the Surf Lifesaving Foundation. # Clive Hammond OAM Award Recipient 2021

The Clive Hammond OAM Award recognises individuals who have made an outstanding and special contribution to the development and / or well-being of their Club or Branch.

## Melinda Jackson

As a volunteer within South Coast Branch, Melinda is a patrolling member of Kurrawa SLSC and a coach, competitor and official with Northcliffe SLSC. She is a member of the South Coast Branch Executive holding the elected roles of Director of Surf Sports, Surf Rescue Coordinator and SCB Pool Rescue Coach. Melinda is also an Emergency Care trainer and has conducted numerous Surf Rescue Certificate, Bronze Medallion, First Aid and Advanced Resuscitation

courses within the Branch.

This season alone Melinda volunteered an average of over 30 hours a week.

Melinda epitomizes the Spirit of lifesaving by 'helping others in need'. She keeps our beaches safe and gives her time to teach others how to save lives. She is passionate about the South Coast Branch, her Clubs and lifesaving. Her ability to share knowledge and skills not just in the area of life saving but also in surf sports,

management, education and training, membership development and strategic direction is amazing.
