THE GIRL WHO TOUCHED THE STARS

Growing up, I loved reading and writing. I often imagined myself as an author, sharing my book with the world. Never did I imagine that childhood fantasy would come true.

In February 2024, I published my memoir “The Girl Who Touched The Stars”, a recount of my 12,700-kilometre paddle around Australia on a surf ski. Ironically, the idea for my big paddle was conceived after reading a book-a biography called “Fearless” about the German woman who had the world record prior to me.

Reading “Fearless” would change my life, sending my career down a totally different trajectory. Prior to my circumnavigation-which saw me spend eight months paddling our beautiful, rugged coastline-I was working across three separate clinics as a dietitian and competing in Surf Lifesaving competitions for fun. Completing my huge paddle in August 2022 and bringing the Guinness World Record for fastest circumnavigation home to Australia, I began writing my book just two weeks after returning. The soles of my feet were so soft it hurt to walk, and my fingers had extremely limited range of motion after gripping my paddle tightly heading into strong south-easterly trade winds down the east coast, but I was able to type. And once I began typing, the words flowed quickly onto the page. Pure emotion poured out as I relived my journey-paddling out from Mermaid Beach accompanied by my fellow Surf Lifesavers, my risky crossing of the Great Australian Bight, the strain the paddle put on my relationship and everything in between-there it was, the paddle of Aus, told in a decidedly raw way.

Since releasing the book, I’ve been fortunate to have carved out a new career as a keynote speaker, sharing my journey with students, athletes and corporates-touching on topics such as resilience, teamwork and leadership. I’ve also recently released a documentary about the paddle-“Diamond of The Sea”, and though it was hard at first to share footage of myself in incredibly vulnerable situations, I knew it was important not to gloss over the ugly parts, the real stuff that’s rarely shown in a world conditioned to believe the highlights reels we consume on social media.

Though my life may look different now to that of the naïve 32-year-old who set out for an adventure three years ago and found a way to keep going, one thing remains the same-I’m still an active member of the Surf Lifesaving movement. I still love connecting with members of all ages at my local club of Mermaid Beach, and the wider Surf Lifesaving community at carnivals. The movement taught me valuable lessons that I used in my big paddle around Australia and wherever my adventures take me, I will always be a Surf Lifesaver.

Member Recognition

National Medal for Service to Surf Lifesaving

Established in 1975 as a military recognition award, the National Medal has since branched out into government and voluntary organisations and is now Australia's most awarded civil medal.

The National Medal is awarded to individuals on behalf of the Governor-General of Australia and recognises long and diligent service in organisations that are dedicated to protecting life and property at a degree of risk to their members. It is awarded to individuals who risk their lives or safety to protect or assist the community in enforcement of the law or in times of emergency or natural disaster.

Surf Life Saving Australia volunteers with a minimum of 30 patrolling hours over a minimum period of 15 seasons, since September 18, 1986 are eligible for the National Medal.

Our Young Local Heroes save life of tourist

15 year old Georgia Hart from Kurrawa SLSC, Levi Knight 16 and Jayda Williams 15, performed CPR on a man who had collapsed with a cardiac arrest on a street in Broadbeach on the 1st September 2023. The trio were walking along the street, when they noticed a man lying on the ground with a lady performing CPR. Georgia said "I am trained in first aid, should we go over there?". They walked over and Levi ended up doing the defib, Georgia was on compressions and Jayda was talking to 000. Calmly they went about their job until the Ambulance arrived and took over.

'Godsends': Trio rush to save life of tourist



Family hails teen heroes

Three Benowa State High School students are being hailed as heroes for saving the life of a tourist after he collapsed in a Broadbeach street.

Year 10 students Georgia Hart, 15, Levi Knight, 16, and Jayda Williams, 15, were walking on Surf Pde at 6pm on Friday, September 1, when they noticed a commotion in a car park at the front of the Belle Mission building.

Lying stricken on the ground was 59-year-old Tony Stuart, his life ebbing away despite the frantic efforts of family and friends.

"We were walking along the street, and as we were walking by we could see somebody on the floor and everyone crowding them," said Georgia, a life-guard at Kurrawa SLSC.

"We stopped to have a look, then we saw the lady drop down and start CPR. That's when I said to Levi and Jayda, 'I'm trained in first aid, should we go over?' We all walked over and Levi ended up doing the defib, I was on compressions and Jayda was talking to 000."

Mr Stuart, a tourist from Ireland visiting relatives, had been returning to his unit when he collapsed, hitting his head hard on the ground.

He had a brain bleed and had gone into cardiac arrest.

The trio said it was a confronting scene, with Mr Stuart's wife Colette distraught.

"There was blood everywhere because he hit his head when he fell down," Levi said.

"The most surreal thing was Colette's reaction: 'Please don't leave me, Tony,'" said Georgia.

"It was bringing tears to my eyes."

Jacqui Cassidy, whose husband is related to Mr Stuart, said they were returning from dinner when it happened.

Ms Cassidy, a registered nurse, had commenced CPR but was in desperate need of help before the three students arrived.

"It's hard to keep going by yourself and then they come along. They were a godsend. They were calm and mature and so collected. It was wonderful. The training with surf lifesaving is just a wonderful thing," Ms Cassidy said. "I don't know I could have kept going any longer. They have definitely helped save his life."

Mr Stuart's family are grateful for a number of boxes of fate. The defibrillator used had only recently been installed at the unit block, while the trio were only in the area because of a chance encounter between the two girls and Levi, who was on his way to work.

They are also grateful the teenagers stopped, unlike many adults who watched on.

"People drove around him," Jayda said. "Jacqui had been there pumping his heart for 10 minutes when we got there. She was shaking. She was in big shock. (Tony's wife) was crying. It was really heart-breaking."

Mr Stuart is recovering in Gold Coast University Hospital, with his family saying they are very grateful for the standard of care by Queensland Health and the Queensland Ambulance Service.

"Aware the teens were Benowa State High students, they reached out to the school to also send them thanks."

Principal Alison Fahlbusch said the school community was very proud of the trio's heroics.

"We're so proud and just so impressed they had such cool heads. Our three kids here are just magnificent."

Australia—Japan Trip



In October of this season, two members of BMD Northcliffe travelled to Iwai Beach, Chiba, Japan to meet with members of the Japan Lifesaving Association and conduct Champion Patrol workshops and work together to prepare team members for competition. Melinda Jackson and Nicola Moore, both coaches and officials of Surf Rescue events, were joined by Natalie Pascoe from Bundaberg SLSC.

In 2017-2019, the Australia-Japan Foundation supported the exchange of young surf lifesavers and officials between Australia and Japan to introduce the Patrol Competition event. Northcliffe SLSC members, Trent Rowe and Tammy Hagan were members of this team. The current 2023-2025 program builds on the strong ties already established with a focus on further developing host clubs, competitors, coaches and officials in Japan.

Melinda, Nicola and Natalie covered all sections of the Patrol Competition during a day of workshops and were able to offer detailed advice at every stage. Long-term connections were strengthened and the technical expertise of Australian lifesavers promoted. Interestingly, oxygen is not used by lifesavers in Japan. Lots of questions were asked and all Japanese members, regardless of their role, were dedicated and passionate.



On the day of the competition, everyone met for an early breakfast and briefing. Teams were welcomed to the Opening Ceremony and began by sitting the theory paper. All events were conducted with competitors and officials provided with detailed feedback after each event. The Japanese officials were very active and aware of their responsibilities. They were very 'present'. They gave the event respect and did their due diligence in preparations to ensure fairness to all competitors.

To celebrate the success of the program and acknowledge the contribution of the Australia-Japan Foundation (AJF), Melinda, Nicola and Natalie travelled to the Australian Embassy in Tokyo where they met members and representatives of the AJF. What an experience, what an opportunity.

Roger joined Surf Life Saving in the early 1950's as a cadet member of Manly LSC where he gained his Bronze Medallion in 1954, his Instructors Certificate in 1957 and his Examiners Certificate in 1961.

From 1982-2012 Roger held a number of positions at Club, Branch & State Levels:

- Southport SLSC—Club President, Deputy President, Team Manager and Supporters Club Committee;
- Branch—Surf Sport Superintendent, Board of Lifesaving/Surf Sports, Board of Examiners and Executive Committee; and
- State – Surf Sports Committee, Surf Sports Safety Advisor, Surf Sports Officials Advisor and BOLS/BOSS Finance Committee.

Roger won Australian Surf Teams and R&R Championships between 1955 and 1962 and QLD R&R in 1982. He officiated at Branch, State and Australian levels for over 30 years and was the Site Manager for the Australian Championships at Kurrawa from 1995 to 2006.

His contribution at all levels of our Association has been extensive, both as a volunteer and in professional capacities. His leadership and vision have been the driving force in many successful initiatives to improve water safety awareness, not only in Queensland, but nationally. This commitment earned him recognition, including the Emergency Services Medal in the Australia Day Honours List of 2016.

His influence in a professional capacity, although not considered extensively by the Committee or State Council, has been instrumental in transforming surf lifesaving in Queensland into a year-round, seamless integration of volunteers, lifeguard services, technology, and support services. His early leadership has created revenue streams for SLSQ, such as lifeguard contracts and the QPS helicopter service contract.

His passion for surf lifesaving and the mantra of "Always Swim Between the Red and Yellow Flags" remains steadfast and never questioned. His contributions have been recognised through Life Membership at Point Lookout SLSC in 1996 and South Coast Branch in 2002.

Peter joined the lifesaving movement in 1996 after his son started Nippers. His involvement began with swimming in the surf with his son to make sure he was safe. And so began an involvement with, and dedication to, lifesaving that has been unwavering, with a focus on active patrolling and Operations Support.

He has amassed over 5,500 patrol hours at his home Club, the highest in the club's documented history. His contribution also extends to Surf Life Saving Queensland Operations Support duties where he has also accumulated over 5,500 hours, meaning a total “on duty” hours of more than 11,000.

His leadership and commitment have made him an influential figure within our surf family. He has served as a Patrol Captain for 15 consecutive seasons, been a mentor for RWC operators, and played a pivotal role in the very successful and highly acclaimed dawn patrols on the Gold Coast.

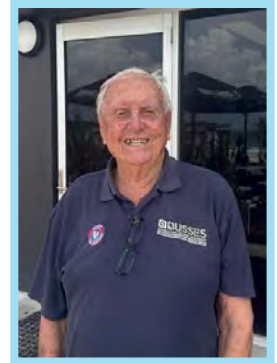

Surf Life Saving Australia is proud to bestow its highest honour on a very deserving member, Claude Jeanneret OAM.

Claude Joined the South Coast Branch in 1953 and his 70 years of continuous service saw him hold a variety of positions along his journey such as Examiner, Official, Superintendent, Officer, District Supervisor and Delegate.

Claude was recognised for his sustained service at a club level with Life Membership at Surfers Paradise SLSC in 1964, and by Northcliffe SLSC in 2002 and has received every SLSA service award from 25 years to 70 years.

For 40 years Claude was a quiet achiever behind the scenes as a Gear Steward and an Official at state run competitions and championships. Claude was awarded Life Membership of SLSQ in 2021 for his outstanding and distinguished service at a state level.

Claude Jeanneret OAM, has held numerous positions of responsibility during his 75 years of continued service. He was also instrumental in pioneering the mouth-to-mouth resuscitation



method for Surf Life Saving, and demonstrated the first public display of Expired Air Resuscitation (EAR) on ABC Channel 2, Brisbane on 13th December 1959. In March 1960, EAR was demonstrated to the International Convention on Life Saving Techniques which endorsed the Expired Air Techniques.

The Queensland Resuscitation Committee had successfully proven that EAR was effective. This endorsement would ultimately lead to the introduction of EAR across lifesaving organisations around the world. It was not only a first in Australia but within the world.

This national honour now completes his distinguished collection, showcasing his unparalleled commitment and contributions to Surf Life Saving Australia.

Our nipper squad remains strong, with great participation at Sunday sessions. We look forward to continuing to grow our nippers next season.

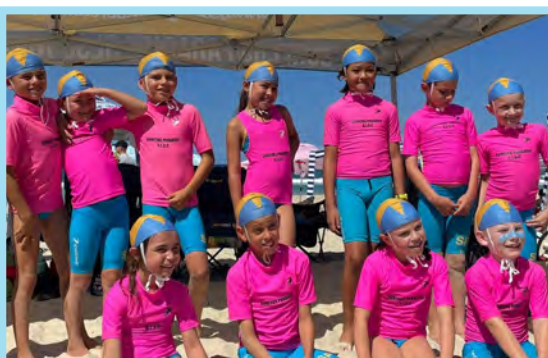

Miami Beach SLSC— Zach Henwood

The 2023/2024 season has been quite eventful for the Miami Beach Surf Life Saving Club, but firstly, it is important to acknowledge the service of our patrolling members and their achievement of zero preventable deaths on our beach. In terms of beach visitation, this season was quieter than the last with 80,000 visitors (nearly 16% lower). This was likely due, in part, to the inclement weather and surf conditions experienced over the summer period, but thankfully, only 1 rescue was performed due to our members' focus on preventative measures.

The season started with an incredible highlight for our relatively small Club as we were awarded the Surf Life Saving Queensland Club of the Year for the 2022/2023 season. This was a significant event and a testament to the considerable passion and dedication shown by our members over many seasons. The Club was also successful in securing the bid to host the 2024 Australian IRB Racing Championships, which will be an exciting opportunity to showcase our Club to the nation. Our members have been working hard this season in preparation for the event, and I have no doubt it will be a great success.

Our total membership remained steady this season with around 780 members, and the Club experienced a slight increase on last year's junior activities members. Unfortunately, our patrolling membership has been experiencing a small, but somewhat consistent decline over the last few seasons. This will be a priority for our Management Committee as we renew our focus on recruitment and retention strategies, and our patrolling experience.

In other areas, I am very proud of the good work of our Director of Education (CTO), Lisa Maddison, in onboarding six new trainers for our Club, and of our Management Committee for supporting their upskilling. This is an incredible achievement, particularly in the face of dwindling numbers of trainers and assessors across the state, and I look forward to seeing how it will shape our education offering in the season ahead. Our Surf Sports team again performed admirably this season across their different sporting disciplines, with a particularly strong performance from our junior competitors on the beach, and a still-growing IRB Racing team that proves to be an attractive pathway for our members. Last, but not least, our Junior Activities Program continued to deliver a vibrant and fun experience for our youngest members.

Over this last season, many of our members have contributed above and beyond to our Club and its community, and I would like to thank them for their efforts. I would also like to acknowledge the unceasing efforts of our Club Administrator, Mel Bruggy. Her work behind the scenes is critical to our success as a Club, and though we won't see her in the Administrator's role next season, I wish her the very best for the next 12 months as she welcomes a new member into her family. This will also be my last season as President of the Miami Beach Surf Life Saving Club; it has certainly been a rewarding experience. And while there is still plenty left to do, I'd like to thank our members and our Club's Management Committee for what we have achieved so far, and I look forward to supporting my successor in the seasons to come.

North Burleigh SLSC—David Rhodes

Over the past year, the North Burleigh SLSC has made remarkable progress and achieved several key milestones. The club has successfully completed significant interior renovations, including a comprehensive overhaul of the first floor, which has improved our education and training areas to better serve and support our members. Additionally, we have established a new gym and launched a professional training program designed to enhance the fitness and wellbeing of our members. In terms of governance, our members have endorsed a new Constitution. We have also invested in and expanded our club operations team to effectively implement our strategic plan.

This season, we welcomed a 6% increase in our membership, reaching a total of 1,033 members. Among these, 172 are patrolling members, with 43% under the age of 18. However, we face a significant gap in the 19-29 age bracket, highlighting the need for ongoing recruitment and training of volunteers. We remain committed to working with SCB and SLSQ to address these challenges.

Beach attendance for the 2023/24 season decreased by 13% compared to the previous season, primarily due to less favourable weather conditions and a shift in travel behaviours post-pandemic. Our patrolling members demonstrated commendable dedication, successfully managing several incidents, including a resuscitation and multiple rescues.

Our Junior Development program remains strong, with 424 participants in the North Burleigh Nippers this season. We are proud to be Branch Champions in the U8-U10 and U11-U15 age groups. Our youth team excelled at the Youth State Championships, securing the state title. We also held a successful Nipper Camp and successfully ran various fundraising events such as Ironmania and raffles throughout the season.

Our athletes have had an outstanding year, delivering remarkable performances at both state and national levels. We proudly had 11 members in the South Coast Branch Team and 5 in the QLD Cyclones Team. This season, we sent our largest team to the Aussies in over a decade, achieving notable results. Summer Murray won the U13 Board and U13 Ironwoman events, while Ryne Spence won the U15 Ironwoman. Alongside other significant achievements across Youth, Opens, and Masters categories, these results reflect the strategic direction and dedication of our surf sports team. The future of surf sports at North Burleigh looks very bright.

Our community partnerships have thrived, with financial support from our partners playing a vital role in providing the necessary resources and opportunities for our members to excel in all major areas. We have developed significant collaborations with local and professional sporting teams, fostering a strong community connection. Our commitment to member engagement is further demonstrated by hosting health and wellbeing workshops, such as Kamana Community and Find Ya Feet. We look forward to offering more of these opportunities to our members in the years to come.

Financially, the club is in a strong position. The Board remains dedicated to seeking out sponsorship opportunities and fostering community partnerships, while also actively pursuing all available grant possibilities.

As we conclude the 2023/24 season, I am proud of the significant achievements we have accomplished together. The dedication of our members and partners has been instrumental to our success. We look forward to maintaining this momentum into the 2024/25 season.

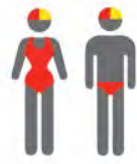

Patrol Development Team Report

Lisa Maddison—Patrol Development Coordinator



The purpose of Patrol Development visits is to ensure and maintain a level of patrol efficiency adequate to ensure safe bathing reserves for locals and visiting beachgoers from Burleigh to Point Lookout.

The Patrol Development Team (PDT) endeavoured to carry out their visits focusing upon the positive aspects of patrolling, aiming to alleviate the stress of an 'inspection' and, instead, use the time to chat with patrolling members about current POM or procedural updates and, also to offer to assist should an incident arise whilst they are visiting a patrol. The predominant focus for the past two years has been active patrolling – with emphasis upon preventative actions being preferable to reaching a rescue scenario. We also promoted active wearing of the hard-earned lifesavers uniform, which helps patrolling members to be identifiable to members of the public and, our colleagues when we are in rescue situations.

Patrol Captains and their teams should be congratulated for their commitment to public safety through roles that occasionally require skills and knowledge that challenge comfort zones. With regards to active patrolling and uniforms, not many clubs lost points in this area – going to show that Patrol Captains have stepped up and ensured that South Coast Branch excels in these areas.

Experienced team members Don Stevenson (Point), Greg Moreton (Mermaid), Chris Haile (Surfers) and Ash Wilson (Broadbeach) have been supporting me with in this position for a few years now. Becki Bonner from BHMP and our new DOLS, Jason Argent (Coochiemudlo), also assisted with visits this year and I am indebted to the entire team for their commitment to lifesaving standards, enthusiasm, and level of altruism. More than 72 Patrol Development 'visits' were conducted by the team this season. The standard has improved so much that it is becoming increasingly difficult to find a clear winner for the Pat Kelly Patrol Efficiency Award.

Joining the PDT in gathering information for end of year awards, was Don Stevenson, who visited every club in the South Coast Branch to assess their First Aid room. In terms of First Aid Room audits, one club managed to get the edge on the other clubs and win the Robin Donchi First Aid Award this season.

As always, I remain thankful and grateful to our DOLS, Don Stevenson and Jason Argent, our DOE, Richard Morgan, and South Coast Branch President, George Hill, who alongside his executive team, continually support me in my quest to manage this role.

We are always looking for people willing to assist with this role during a season – so if you have a passion for sharing experiences and knowledge, please do not hesitate to get in touch. This experience makes you a better lifesaver as the knowledge derived adds to your knowledge, skills and understanding. It builds perspective.

To those of you who proudly wear the respected 'Red and Yellow Cap,' thanks for another terrific season. We look forward to seeing you on the beach next season.

Finance Report

Darren Woodward—Director of Finance and Property

It is with privilege that I present the South Coast Branch Inc Financial Report for the 2023 / 2024 Lifesaving Season.

From a financial standpoint, the Branch was able to fulfil its objectives of supporting the Clubs in our region including extending support in identified areas that clubs had identified as being important to their strategic and operational objectives.

The accompanying financial statements (pp 83-99) outline our finance related activities for the season and highlight where the branch has increased its investment in activities for our clubs to not only provide the volunteer services to our community – but to also attract and hopefully retain members through increased participation in lifesaving and surf sports programs.

With the introduction of a new strategic plan this year, your Board will continue to work with clubs to ensure initiatives that are the subject of further investment will continue to align with your needs and priorities in coming seasons which will include the targeted use of funds that we have at our disposal.

Unfortunately this year, the Gold Coast City Council (GCCC) didn't deliver their annual grants program to community organisations due to a range of factors including the timing of the local government elections. Along with the forecasted acquittals this season of grant funding that was received last season, these ultimately contributed to the branch incurring a net loss position that was reasonably close to the originally budgeted position. At the time of writing this report, we can advise that GCCC has confirmed that the Branch will be the recipient of \$50,000 per annum for a 2 year period which we can now confidently factor into budgets for the coming couple of seasons.

This season, clubs were faced with the challenge of rising costs across all areas of operations which is something that not only the Branch – but collectively with SLSQ – we need to act on how the movement supports our clubs and their members. The Branch will continue to press our collective position on these matters as they arise at every level with SLSQ at any opportunity we can and the support of the Branch Council this year has been appreciated – and will be necessary as we move forward into the future.

Through the dedicated efforts of our Administrator – Kym Trinca – the Branch continued its success where we could in attracting grant commitments that were again aimed at funding specific projects within the Branch.

We would like to specifically acknowledge the following for their contribution to the Branch and the Clubs within our region, ensuring their ongoing financial viability: -

The Queensland Government
Gold Coast City Council
Redland City Council
Surf Lifesaving Queensland
The Surf Lifesaving Foundation – Grants Seeking Unit

Looking ahead to the 2024/25 season and beyond, we will commence this period in a strong position with just over \$180,000 in cash reserves and a further \$255,000 in long term investments.

2023/24 saw the 2nd year of the Services Agreement with SLSQ. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank our Regional Manager – Nathan Fife; our Regional Administration Officer – Cathleen Edgar; and the rest of the Regional Office for their support of the Branch and our Clubs this season as and when called upon. Whilst the Agreement has progressively delivered on some of its key objectives, the Branch is currently in the process of revisiting aspects of it to ensure areas that aren't quite aligning with our Clubs priorities and needs are being reconsidered. This will be reported back to Branch Council as and when things develop.

In closing, I would like to thank my fellow members of the Branch Board; Branch Councillors; SLSQ; Carol Shanks (our ever-diligent bookkeeper!); Wayne (Rabbits) McLennan for his astute management and care of branch gear and equipment; and finally Kym Trinca – our Administrator for her dedicated and professional support and assistance throughout the past year.

In addition to the IRB Course, SLSQ ran a Club Captain / Chief Training Officer (CTO) long weekend workshop at Sea World, which was well represented by the Branch CTOs and provided a great opportunity for the Branch CTOs to catch up and discuss some general concerns in a relaxed environment.

September, we ran a Branch based Silver Medallion Patrol Captain Course, again hosted by Southport SLSC, who not only provided great facilities and beach equipment for patrol scenarios, but some wonderful actors, who could easily make Hollywood movies. This Course is usually run over a full weekend, with an additional 5 hours of online learning. However, in conjunction with SLSQ, it was trialed over a single day, which was appreciated by all concerned and the outcome demonstrated this could be delivered as a one-day course. 10 members attended the course from 4 Branch Clubs. Appreciation to Don Stevenson for Facilitating this course and Richard Morgan who attended to gain the Award, seeking to become a Facilitator for this Award to help increase the Branch capacity to deliver more courses through the season. A second Silver Medallion Patrol Captain was run at the end of the season with Evan Thomas as the main Facilitator, supported by Don Stevenson and Lisa Maddison, and Richard Morgan as a Proby Facilitator. 10 members attended the course from 5 Branch Clubs, and although the face-to-face component was delivered over one day, at least two online sessions were provided to track the online requirements.

A key change to the start of the season was SLSQ introduction of their new eLearning platform aXcelerate and the new online Hub. Although introduced at the start of September, just as Clubs began organizing their School Holiday courses, the long-term benefit of this system was apparent however the change management and training for CTOs, Assessors and Club Administrators was very late and added to an already busy workload. A further issue is Club Administrators have less access to operate within the aXcelerate platform compared to Courses organized through SurfGuard, placing more responsibility on CTOs/Club Assessors.

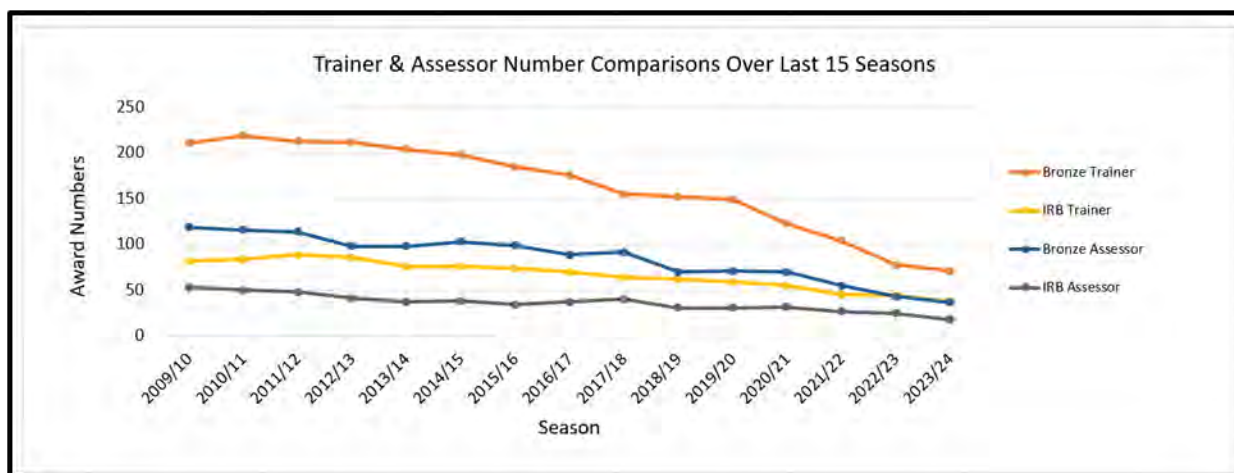
Regrettably the season started with four Clubs without a CTO, which made it very difficult for Clubs, particularly with the new aXcelerate online system requiring qualified Trainers and Assessors to administer the system. This also had some major impacts on one Club, where SLSQ had to intervene to help with the processing of some Bronze Courses, and some members had to join an IRB Course at Southport to train new members.

Although there is some disappointment with the lack of progress with Phase 1 of the Education Reforms proposed by the State President, the introduction of the new Education & Training Supervisor Gold Coast has been well received and will provide a benefit to Clubs struggling to keep ahead. Although Phase 1 of these reforms was proposed last season, there has been no mention of Phase 2.

The ongoing decline of Trainers and Assessor is still a year-on-year concern, with several Clubs resorting to engaging external RTOs at considerable costs to help bridge this gap. At the time of writing this report, SLSQ has released the new Trainer's Course and provided a series of dates for members to attend training for these Awards, however, South Coast Branch has only been provided one weekend face-to-face option, which is combined with Point Danger Branch, and although some further online options are available, further face-to-face options would be the preferred solution. To support the recovery with new Trainers, South Coast Branch is also investigating funding some Trainer Courses through external RTOs.

SLSQ has introduced more options for the use of Endorsed Delegates to Assess Awards, and Skills Maintenance, there is a risk this may result in a reduction of standards and a reluctance of members to become trainers. It is also a concern that some Endorsed Delegate Awards are not aligned with Surfguard, particularly IRB Drivers and requires IRB Assessors to have their awards maintained to process Awards through the Assessor App.

The graph below clearly identifies the year-on-year decline of Trainers and Assessors, which is going to take some time to return to levels of 5 years ago.



Although the ongoing reduction in TAFs is adding to the pressure on CTOs it also appears to be having an impact on Awards delivered during the season. The Aquatic Awards (Bronze/SRC) and IRB Crew award seem to be consistent, however, the IRB Driver Award and Emergency Care Awards have all continued decreasing. The impact of the IRB Drivers is noticeable, whereby lack of IRB Drivers is having an impact on Patrols. The reduction in Emergency Care Awards is a major concern as the AID Awards are being retired 30th June 2024, resulting in over 900 members across the Branch needing to attend at least one course to update their Awards, before the start of the season. SLSQ have been requested to extend the Advanced Resuscitation Awards [AID] (ART [AID]) to 31st December 2024, aligned to Skills Maintenance to relieve some of this pressure. A significant impact on upgrading the ART Awards, is the new Award stipulates the First Aid as a pre-requisite requiring some members to complete both a First Aid Course and an ART Course.

It has also been suggested to SLSQ that they consider removing the Award, Provide advanced resuscitation and oxygen therapy (HLTAID015) as the base for ART and work with SLSA to create a bridging course for the SLSA ART Award. Although this will be a move away from the RTO having to provide this Award, the Award is very specialist and not in high demand within Industry, it is not a general Work Health and Safety requirement as with the First Aid Award.

Table 2 identifies the Awards updated through annual Skills Maintenance, and although these are consistent with previous seasons, they do not show evidence of growth within the Organisation, highlighting new Awards are only matching decline in members not renewing, and can be reflected in member retention rates.

To turn this around, a multi-phased membership drive is needed, along with a major drive to increase the number of trainers and assessors to support the delivery of more courses. South Coast Branch is considering more Branch run courses for 2024/25, however, this should only be seen as an interim measure.



The South Coast Branch is blessed with a core of dedicated and high-quality Trainers and Assessors who year-on-year continue to keep Clubs running and provide hours of their time willingly and voluntarily. Unless we support the pathway for reform, it is likely we will witness more fallout and more Clubs not being able to run sufficient courses to grow.

Finally, as with every season, I would like to extend my appreciation and thanks to all the Trainers and Assessors within the Clubs, those who provide water safety, general assistance, and administration, as without this support, the delivery of Courses and Skills Maintenance at both Club and Branch level would not be achieved.

I wish everyone well for the 2024/25 season.

Junior Competitions U8-U10s

The Little Squirts Twilight Beach and Water carnivals, for our youngest nippers, encourage participation for all abilities. Club spirit was highlighted at Miami by hundreds of nippers in the colourful march past event, and the conditions at Kurrawa proved very challenging for the competitors in the water events. 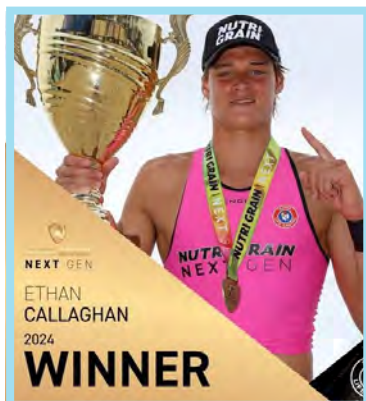

Ironman legend **Ali Day** has extended his reign as the greatest ever athlete to compete in the Shaw and Partners Financial Services Coolangatta Gold, winning his 9th title on the Gold Coast in October 2023. Day, who has won the race every time he's started, was eager to add another Coolangatta Gold title to his trophy cabinet, but knew it wasn't going to be an easy feat with one of the strongest fields ever assembled.

The 33-year-old found himself in an unfamiliar position, trailing after the opening ski leg, but knew he could count on his strength in the swim, and was able to lead for the remainder of the gruelling 41.8km race.

"I really like the swim leg, it's my bread and butter. But you're still really worried because Bevy (Matt Bevilacqua) is one of the best ironmen ever and that's sort of where I made my move."

It's a bloody tough race, and I'm super stoked to have another one under my belt," he said.

"It definitely hasn't been an easy time in the preparation for this, but I've got a great support crew who have been with me through the last 20 weeks and I'm really grateful for them," he said.

Bevilacqua finished in second place, followed by Taylor in third (Northcliffe).

Gold Coaster **Lana Rogers** returned to the top of the Coolangatta Gold podium, after winning her first title in 2019.

Having made the move south from Alexandra Headland to Northcliffe in the off season, Rogers said she was so proud that all of her hard work has paid off. "It does not feel real at all. It's been a long four months of preparation." Rogers said.

"To win it once is special, but to win it twice is unbelievable. I want to write myself in the history books, I've watched this race since I was 9 years old and I've watched Ali win it 9 times now.

"It's very special to me, I think it's the toughest race to win in surf lifesaving and only the toughest athletes race it," she said. "I'm sharing this one with Naomi Flood and Georgia Miller, we did this whole prep together and it's really, really special," she said.

"It's been a long four months of preparation, and it's been a big four months but I've just learnt to embrace the process. We've got a big season ahead of us, so it's exciting times and I'm so happy that it's starting this way," she said.

Rounding out the Ironwoman podium were Surfers Paradise's Ironwoman legend Courtney Hancock in second, and young gun Lucy Derbyshire in third.

1. **Statement of Accounting Policies**

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Association Incorporations Act*. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act*, and the following Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements:

No other Australian Accounting Standards or authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared accruals basis and is based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

(b)Property Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Buildings are valued at fair value less accumulated depreciation. Building Improvements are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

The Branch Headquarters are designated as a special purpose non-residential building and net replacement value is utilised as fair value. The building was independently valued on 30 April 2004. The building has since been revalued using ABS Index 6427 – Construction of Non-Residential Buildings Queensland. This revaluation was made effective from 1 May 2010. A review of this index in May 2012 revealed that the variation in this index was -0.4%. The Committee resolved that this movement was immaterial and not to revalue the building in 2013/14. No further revaluation has been made at 30 April 2024.

Depreciation has been applied over the useful life of the assets as follows:-

Zach is first and foremost a surf lifesaver and patrol captain at Miami Beach, volunteering 60.25 hours during this season. As Club President, Zach has a significant responsibility to the governance, management, compliance, and operations of the Miami Beach Surf Life Saving Club. As the longest-serving member within the current Management Committee, Zach also provides support and guidance to the other Committee members, subcommittees, and Club Officers. This role also comes with a position on the South Coast Branch Council.

Within SLSQ, Zach volunteered as a Program Coordinator for the Leadership Excellence Program (LEP) held in November 2022, the two Lifesaving Development Programs (LDP) held in April 2023 and June 2023, and is part of a working group to implement a new Advanced Lifesaving Development Program for the 2023/2024 season. These roles involve preparation and planning over a typically 6-month period. Within SLSA, Zach attended the National Leadership College (NLC) held in July 2022 as a participant. Of particular value to our frontline lifesaving services, LDP is a 7-day intensive program where participants gain their FA, ART, and IRB awards in a scenario-based, experiential learning format.

Other Club roles and responsibilities include:

- IRB Racing co-coach, behind the scenes team manager, and competitor – consisting of a team of 22, the Miami IRB Team took out the U23 Australian IRB point score and came 3rd in the Opens Australian IRB point score. Zach medalled in several races at the State and Australian Championships.
- Nipper coach for the Junior Activities Program board rotation
- Content expert for Club IRB courses

Zach, with his brother Isaac, undertook the coaching role for the Miami IRB Racing Team. Zach maintains a team culture of teamwork, participation, and respect. As a result, the team were recipients of the David Jones Memorial Achievement Award. Zach also provided fundraising opportunities to support the team members' participation in the sport. Due to their involvement, all IRB Team members are actively engaged in Club activities, and provide expert-level IRB support on patrol.

As a patrol captain, Zach leads a team of 15 members with an average age of 19. In this capacity, Zach understands the pressures and external commitments of members at these ages and ensures flexibility for their attendance at patrols. As a result of Zach's leadership among his patrol, (not to mention the IRB team, the committee, and the wider Club), we have several youths remaining active members after Nippers

The work he does behind the scenes for the Management Committee and for the governance of the Club cannot be overstated. Zach volunteers a large amount of his time surf lifesaving. Everyone who has the pleasure of meeting Zach is witness to how he models our Club values. Despite the challenges or issues thrown his way he is always fair and caring. Miami Beach has benefited in countless ways and continues to benefit from his contributions. We are immensely proud to have Zach as a member of Miami Beach Surf Life Saving Club. Zach is forward thinking and looks to improve the Club for the benefit of the current and future members.
